Carly Cushing and Jill Manha, with Churchill County Social Services discussed the CART program and how the transition to Churchill County Social Services is being addressed. The

process is the same, except instead of calling the CART phone number, people are to call the William N. Pennington Life Center for ride reservations, and senior medical appointments take priority. They have been given approval to hire more staff and hope to be fully staffed in the early part of the new year. Meals on Wheels drivers will cross-train to also drive for CART. They are also looking to expand the program once fully staffed.

Samantha Berger, with Nevada Rural Counties Retirees Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP), discussed the program, which provides local and out of town rides for seniors and is based out of Carson City, but serves all rural areas. To reserve a ride, people need to call five days in advance, and must be a client, which requires an application to be submitted to RSVP. They are also looking for seniors to volunteer to drive for the program, which also requires a submitted application.

Chair Kent asked if there was any public comment but there was none.

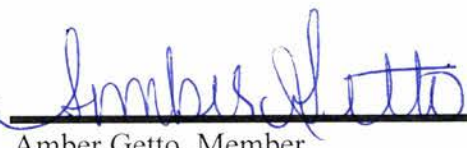
