TGFD program is currently utilizing Google Classroom to present videos on the lessons to the students due to Covid. The TGFD program has also continued implementation of the incentives for completing lessons and the program in its entirety. The Resource Liaisons are noticing tools learned from the TGFD program being utilized by the students such as control of emotions. They are also seeing the mindful practices that are being taught in conjunction with the lessons being utilized by the students. TGFD program was scheduled to teach at the Care Program this 3rd quarter but the program moved locations so we pushed in classroom learning to 4th quarter. TGFD program is also scheduling to be in at the Fallon Youth Club. We will also be scheduling for the CCSD Summer program.

Kadie Zeller had the following report:

Mental Health Wellness Community Mural Campaign Funds Q3 Report:

Churchill Community Coalition Outreach Coordinator, Kadie Zeller, is still working on locating and securing a space for the larger Community Mural, preferably one close to the downtown Fallon area that will be easily accessible to the public. The goal is to have a piece designed by multiple local artists to highlight the diversity of support for mental health wellness in the community. The art submission project is being advertised via social media, press-releases to local news outlets and flyers sent to local businesses and community organizations.

Efforts to paint a mural at the Churchill County Juvenile Probation Office (JPO) facility are underway. The theme will follow the community theme, "You're Gonna Be Okay." JPO youth will help construct and paint the mural.

Churchill County now has one functioning Karma Box, located at the Fallon Chamber of Commerce. Director Lucy Carnahan has agreed to house and maintain the finished box. With the help of funds donated by Ollar Construction, two more boxes were built by a young men's group from the Latter Day Saints Church. The Hero Club will paint the box for the United Epworth Methodist Church location and another group will paint the box for the Churchill County Sheriff's Office location. Churchill County School District (CCSD) Director of Learning and Innovation, Derild Parsons, has been collaborating with Kadie to establish one Karma Box at each CCSD school.

The Mental Health Wellness Sticker campaign has been a success. Over 700 stickers have been disseminated to community members of all ages. Stickers were printed in English and Spanish and given to Telegraph Coffee and Tap and Espresso De Café to hand out to patrons, from which we received ample amounts of positive feedback and messages of thanks from community members sharing how they felt supported. Stickers have also been disseminated to students, businesses, organizations and any other individual/entity that requested them.

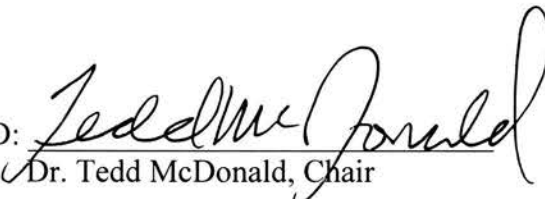
students in the fall and graduation was planned in person for CCHS.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:29 AM.

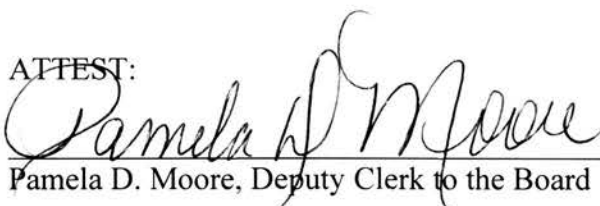
