**Call to Order** – Vice-Chairman Tedford called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

**Verification of the posting of the agenda** - RTC Secretary Steele verified she posted the agenda per NRS 241 on the 8th day of June 2022 between the hours of 2:30 and 3:30 p.m. at the locations listed on the agenda. Those locations include the Churchill County Administration Building, Churchill County Web Site, and the State of Nevada Website.

**Public Comments** – Vice-Chairman Tedford asked if there were any public comments. There were no noted comments.

**Consideration and possible action re: Review and adoption of agenda** – County Manager Barbee motioned to approve the agenda as posted. Motion seconded by the City of Fallon Chief of Staff Erickson and carried by unanimous vote.

**Consideration and possible action re: Review and Adoption of Minutes** – County Manager Barbee motioned to approve the minutes of the regular RTC meeting of May 18, 2022, as submitted. Motion seconded by the Chief of Staff Erickson and carried by unanimous vote.

**Consideration and possible action re: June Treasurer's Report** – Comptroller Sherry Wideman presented the June Treasurer's report as follows:

Comptroller Wideman reported the Regional Transportation Fund 280 has a balance of \$2,184,784 of which the city has a balance of \$1,358,282, and the county has a balance of

\$826,502. The county has an encumbrance of \$125,000, leaving an available balance of \$701,502. The City has an encumbrance of \$900,000, leaving an available balance of \$458,282.

The Public Transit Fund 395 has a balance of \$2,266,901. The county has an encumbrance of \$125,000, leaving an available balance of \$1,254,267. The city has an encumbrance of \$800,000 leaving an available balance of \$87,634.

The county's portion of the One-Cent Fund has an available balance of \$205,961.

The graph for the Regional Transportation Fund 280, which includes the diesel tax, is up 42.3% over the previous Fiscal Year. For the Public Transit Fund 395, the quarter-cent sales tax, the increase over the previous fiscal year is 9.4%. The One-Cent Fund, which shows us a more accurate relationship of the gas taxes, without the diesel, is up 10.4%,

The gallonage report shows there were 948,088 gallons of gas and 839,088 gallons of diesel sold during the month of March.

**County Manager Barbee motioned to approve the June Treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by the Chief of Staff Erickson and carried by a unanimous vote.**

**City Reports and/or Requests- The City did not have any requests**

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**General Discussion of City and/or County Matters-**

**City Reports** – The City did not have any reports.

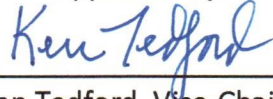
